Biographical Sketch: Allen Gerald Bedford was born February 28, 1925 to parents Ernest Hamilton Bedford and Janet Ruth Iverach in Isabella, Manitoba. Bedford's family moved to Melita, Manitoba, in 1938, where Bedford attended high school until his graduation in 1942. Bedford began his undergraduate degree at United College in 1943 and qualified for a General Bachelor of Arts degree in 1946, after having spent several years pursuing studies in English, Philosophy, and Mathematics. Bedford spent 1946-1948 lecturing in Mathematics at the College, while also conducting some graduate work and completing his fifth year of study in Arts and his Bachelor of Arts (Honours) degree. Bedford graduated with an Master of Arts in Philosophy from the University of Manitoba in 1950, and a Ph.D. in English from the University of Toronto in 1957. Bedford joined the United College's faculty in 1951, first as a professor of Mathematics, and, after receiving his Ph.D., for the following 40 years as a professor of English. While a member of the United College and University of Winnipeg faculty, Bedford was highly involved in the academic community as Registrar of United College, Advisor to Student Council, Dean of Men's Residence, Chairman of the English Department, as an influential member on many faculty boards and committees, and was as well an active member of many professional associations. Bedford retired from the University of Winnipeg in 1991.

Bedford was awarded the Robin H. Farquhar Award for Excellence for contributions to the University in 1990, the Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Excellence in Teaching in 1991, the Distinguished Alumni Award in 1992, and was made a fellow of United College in 1993.

Bedford, who acted as University historian as well as professor, wrote a two volume history of the University of Winnipeg. *The University of Winnipeg – A History of Founding Colleges* was published in 1976 and was awarded the Margaret McWilliams Award. *The University of Winnipeg: Volume II: The First Forty Years, 1967-2007* was published in 2007.

Bedford married Norma Jean Douglas on July 31, 1954. Together they had three sons: Douglas, Dale and James.

Bedford passed away December 4th, 2008.

Custodial History: The fonds was donated to the University of Winnipeg on several occasions between 2007 and 2010 by Professor Bedford and his family.

Scope and Content: The records in the A. Gerald Bedford fonds are those of two accessions; Accession 07.004 and Accession 10.001. Accession 07.004 contains records that were given to Bedford by Edith Baragar, as well as historical material collected by Bedford as he conducted research for his books. Accession 10.001 contains primarily records that were created or collected by Bedford throughout his

education and academic career. These records begin with those created by Bedford during his undergraduate degree at United College, and encompass the following 50-plus years that Bedford spent studying, teaching, researching, writing and publishing. Accession 10.01 also includes the historical records of George Bryce and William John Rose, collected by Bedford and donated to the archives along with his own materials.

Arrangement: Light rearrangement has been implemented upon the order of the records where original arrangements were absent. Accession 07.004 has been arranged into a series titled Historical Research Materials and the Edith Baragar sous-fonds. Accession 10.001 is arranged into the series Student Records, Academic Career -- which consists of the sub-series Faculty Records, Professional Associations, Course Materials, Professional Correspondence, and Addresses and Writings --, Research Materials, and Personal Records, as well as the Rose Family sous-fonds and the George Bryce sous-fonds.

Biographical Sketch: Edith Robertson was born March 8, 1895 to parents John Robertson and Christie McLeod in Winnipeg. Edith attended Wesley College, and graduated in 1917. After having been engaged

since May 20, 1915, Edith Robertson married Frederick D. Baragar December 31, 1919. Together they had three children.

Custodial History: The records in this sous-fonds were discovered amongst the records collected by Bedford and donated to the archives by Bedford in 2007.

Scope and Content: The sous-fonds includes Programmes for the Wesley College 1910 and 1911 Annual banquets and an envelope of photographs taken at Wesley College.

Scope and Content: The records in this series are those created or collected by Bedford during his years as a student, including lecture notes, essays or other course work, exams, and scholarship material. Bedford's interest in Philosophy, English, and Mathematics is easily traceable throughout these records, which include materials from his undergraduate, master's and doctorate studies.

Biographical Sketch:

Emily Mary Cuthbert was born in Portage la Prairie in 1887. In 1912, she married William John Rose, and together they traveled and lived in Poland and other parts of Europe, Hanover, New Hampshire, London, England, and eventually in British Columbia, Canada. Emily Rose passed away in 1952.

William John Rose (1885-1968) was born on a farm near Minnedosa, Manitoba. In 1900 he enrolled in Wesley College. As a boy of nine he was present on 26 June, 1894, at the laying of the corner stone of the building now known as Wesley Hall. In 1905, upon graduation in Classics and Mathematics, he became the first Rhodes Scholar of Wesley (the second in Manitoba, following John McLean of Manitoba College in 1904) and journeyed to Oxford where he received B.A. and M.A. degrees, after which he returned to his alma mater to teach Classics and Mathematics in 1912. That year he married Emily Mary Cuthbert, who was born in Portage la Prairie in 1887, and with his wife left for Germany where he intended to pursue a doctorate in classics, and Emily to further her musical education. Plans changed,

however, when Rose agreed to go to Prague as a Student Christian Movement Secretary. The S.C.M. was then a branch of the Y.M.C.A., an organization which was heavily engaged in missionary work. Rose had been a member of the latter since his undergraduate days. The Roses were caught in Poland when war broke out in 1914 and were unable to emerge until late in 1918. Rose had become fluent in Polish and when he made an appearance in France he was able to assist in the Paris Peace Conference agreements. After a brief visit home he returned to Europe and engaged in relief and social work until 1927. He registered for courses in Jagiellonian University, Cracow, and in 1926 successfully presented a thesis, written under Stanislaw Kot, for the fulfillment of a Ph.D.

In 1928, Rose accepted a teaching appointment in Dartmouth College, Hanover, New Hampshire, during which period he completed his first book, *The Drama of Upper Silesia*. In 1935, partly through the efforts of Sir Bernard Pares, he was called to the School of Slavonic Studies, University of London, becoming Professor in 1938 and Director in 1939. He remained in this post until retirement at the age of sixty-five, publishing four more books, and becoming widely known as an able teacher and public lecturer. He returned to Canada in 1950, and found a home in the University of British Columbia, where he was instrumental in establishing a Department of Slavic Studies. His beloved wife died suddenly in 1952. He again taught at United College in 1953-1954. Following this time, he returned for two years to Vancouver, after which he retired again, and settled in Naramata, B.C. on the eastern shore of Lake Okanagan, teaching and assisting in the Christian School.

William John Rose passed away in 1968.

Custodial History: The letters were in the custody of Mr. Chester Cuthbert, nephew to Dr. and Mrs. Rose and the correspondent to and from whom the collection of letters was written. In 2002 Mr. Cuthbert and his wife Muriel placed the letters in A. Gerald Bedford's custody with the provision that he do "something appropriate" with the collection. Bedford approached the University of Winnipeg archivist, Mr. Peter James, and donated the letters as archival material.

Scope and Content: The sous-fonds consists of correspondence between Mrs. Rose (until 1952) and Dr. Rose (thereafter) and Mr. Chester Cuthbert, the nephew of Emily (Cuthbert) Rose, beginning in 1932 when the Roses were in Dartmouth College, and continuing until the death of Dr. Rose in 1968. The letters describe personal and family matters and illustrate the serious concerns of a Canadian family in the mid-twentieth century as well as the pressing problems of a Canadian couple in a volatile Europe during the same period.

Sources: Much of the biographical sketch, custodial history and scope and content are taken from the preface written by Bedford upon donating the collection of letter to the archives.

Biographical Sketch: Reverend George Bryce (1844-1931) served the Presbyterian and United Churches of Canada for over fifty years. Bryce was born in Mount Pleasant, Ontario, on April 22, 1844, to parents George and Catherine (Henderson) Bryce of Perthshire, Scotland. He was the eldest of four brothers born to the Bryce family: George, Peter, Alec and Robert. George Bryce received his early education at Brantford High School. In 1863, he entered the University of Toronto, graduating in 1868 with a Bachelor of Arts and Masters of Arts degrees. During his university career, Bryce served as ensign to the Queen's Own Rifles regiment, and was present at the Fenian Raid at Ridgeway. In 1869, he entered Knox College in Toronto. Following his studies, Bryce was sent to Quebec City to serve Chalmers Church. His service at Chalmers, however, was interrupted by a request of the Presbyterian Church that he move to the Red River settlement and establish a Presbyterian college among the settlers of Kildonan. Rev. Bryce arrived in Winnipeg in 1871 and served as both an administrator and teacher at Manitoba and United Colleges for the predominance of his career. He also contributed to the founding of several congregations in Winnipeg and Manitoba. Rev. Bryce served as the first moderator of the Manitoba Synod in 1884 and as moderator of the General Assembly in 1902. In addition to his commitment to the church, Bryce was committed to science, history and education. He was one of the founders of the Historical and Scientific Society of Manitoba, serving as secretary to the organization for several years, and later as president. Through a distance study program Bryce was educated in law, and he received his L.L.B. from the University of Toronto in 1878. Four years later, he published his first book: "Manitoba, Its Infancy, Growth and Present Condition." Some of his later works include: "The Remarkable History of the Hudson's Bay Company," and "A Short History of the Canadian People." In 1902, Rev. Bryce was elected to the Royal Society of Canada, and in 1910, he served as president of the Society. Having retired from Manitoba College in 1909, Bryce was appointed to the Royal Commission on Industrial Training and Technical Education in 1910. He spent many of his later years away from Winnipeg, though he returned during the war years to help fill local pulpit vacancies. Bryce married Marion Samuel, the former head mistress of Mrs. Birnie's Ladies School in Toronto, in 1872. The couple shared one child, George Norman Bryce, who died within one year of birth. Marion Bryce passed away in 1920. Bryce subsequently lived with his brother Peter in Ottawa. Rev. Bryce passed away in August of 1931.

Custodial History: The letters of this sous-fonds were discovered amongst the A. Gerald Bedford papers with instruction "for placing in Univ. Archives."

Scope and Content: This sous-fonds contains 4 letters from George Bryce addressed to 'My dear Sir' relating to Manitoba College and its faculty members.
